


FOLLOW THE JOURNEY OF THE HUMPBACK WHALE




Each whale watching trip is hosted by an expert guide on Mozambique's marine life. Combine whale watching with an excursion to see the friendly dolphins at play, who live in our waters all year round. This allows you to get up close to the dolphins while also getting a glimpse of our other natives such as giant turtles and whale sharks. Guests may also glimpse the elusive dugong, as Bazaruto boasts the largest population of these rare sea mammals in the western Indian Ocean.

The most common whale species spotted are humpback and southern right. The whales migrate to cold waters in high latitudes for feeding, before moving on to warmer waters for mating and giving birth.

Southern right whales are best seen close to the shore of Anantara Bazaruto in the southern part of the Mozambique Channel. Between July and October, the humpback whales showcase their acrobatic skills in the waters of the Bazaruto Archipelago. These creatures can propel their upper bodies as high as ten metres above the surface.
