

Pets Policy

PETS ALLOWED

- Dogs and cats only
- Max. weight 25 kg
- A maximum of one pet allowed per room

INCLUSIONS

- · One mat per pet
- · Bowls for water and food
- Pet toys

RATES

- USD 150 for the first night / USD 100 per extra night
- The above charges are for the room only and include tax.
 Any other costs incurred will be charged directly to the guest.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Pets are not allowed to stay alone in the room, except during breakfast hours (from 7.00 am 10.00 am) lunch (from 12.30 pm 3.00 pm) and dinner (from 7.00 pm 10.00 pm). It will be necessary to provide a contact telephone number and be reachable within the hotel.
- Cats can be left alone in the room, but the owner will be responsible for their proper behaviour and any damage they may cause.
- Pets are not allowed in the Wellness areas of the hotel (spa, gym, pool).
- Pets are not allowed in the Restaurants and Bars.
- The use of a leash with a maximum length of 1 meter and a carrier is mandatory in common areas.
- Any damage caused by the animal will be the responsibility of the owner and a charge will be made to the credit card for the replacement of the damaged object.
- In case of noise or inconvenience caused by the pet, the hotel reserves the right to expel the client and the pet.
- The pet is not allowed to use the bath or showers of the rooms.
- It is not allowed to use the towels or sheets to clean your pet.





MAIN LOCAL REGULATIONS ABOUT DOGS IN PUBLIC AREAS

Keep your dog on a leash

In pedestrian zones and on streets with heavy pedestrian traffic as well as in public buildings or on public transport, dogs must be kept on a leash no longer than 1 metre. Dangerous breeds are required to wear a muzzle. In public parks and woodland, the leash may be up to 2 metres long. The above does not apply for designated dog exercise areas. In such areas, dogs do not need to wear a muzzle either.

Areas prohibited to dogs

Some public parks, all playgrounds and some public buildings (e.g. some tourist attractions, museums, concert venues and churches) and shops and restaurants generally prohibit dogs. Before visiting a public place, please check their respective website or consult the local Tourism Information Services.

Removal of dog faeces

Dog owners are obliged by law to pick up their dogs' faeces and dispose of it in a public litter bin. Failure to do so may incur a penalty fee.

Dogs on public transportation

Dogs must be kept leashed in trains, buses and trams as well as at bus, tram and railway stations. Please consult the website of the transportation companies to be aware of the specific policies and fees applicable.
